Have contingency plans for shelter or alternative indoor activity. Encourage proper clothing and sunscreen application if necessary
Slips, Trips and Falls	All Present	 Risk: Uneven terrain or wet ground can cause slips, trips, and falls. Control Measures: Area will be inspected before activity to identify potential hazards. Participants will be advised to watch their step and wear appropriate footwear
